Providers in Tacoma: Expenses must occur between 7/1/2020 - 10/25/2020 and must not have been reimbursed by another agency (ex. DCYF grant). An expense summary and accompanying documentation is due to Child Care Resources no later than 10/25/20. Any amount that is not substantiated will need to be returned to CCR by 11/10/20.

Providers in Pierce County: Expenses must occur between 7/1/2020 - 11/25/2020 and must not have been reimbursed by another agency (ex. DCYF grant). An expense summary and accompanying documentation is due to Child Care Resources no later than 11/25/20. Any amount that is not substantiated will need to be returned to CCR by 12/21/20.
